RAM 2016 in Review

This year presented us with challenges like none we have experienced before.

The Forsman Farms, Inc. project is by far the largest project to date for RAM, not only in contract value but in total square footage of all 10 buildings. When completed there will be 832,530 SF or 19.11 acres of buildings as part of a complex that will house over one million chickens and produce 279 million eggs per year.



The magnitude of this project has tested all parts of our company and I am proud to report that all have responded very well and proven that we are up for the challenge. This was accomplished while continuing to service our normal prospect and customer load that comes from our ever expanding market area. We had a very good year in Northern MN and out west in ND. We are continuing to grow the Alexandria and Mankato market areas. The home base territories surrounding Winsted were solid with plenty of leads and sales that locked up the direct labor force with plenty of work well into winter.



We are looking forward to next year with a large quantity of prospective buyers ready to go. The sales outlook is strong and the Forsman complex will be continuing throughout the entire 2017 work year. This will allow us to grow our carpentry crews and support staff knowing the work load is stable and ready to make 2017 the best year ever.





Team Work

It has been a busy year for both the companies, with many projects combining the forces of both **RAM GC** and **RAM EXC** to complete. A main factor this year was the weather! It didn't (and continues not to) cooperate with us on many of the jobs, but both our teams have managed to work hard to overcome all obstacles Mother Nature threw at them.

RAM GC started the year off with a bang by winning not one, but TWO National Frame Building Association Building of the Year Awards. They were presented to us at the NFBA Expo in Indianapolis in March. The first Building of the Year Award was for a retrofit of a concrete batch plant for STRATA Corporation in North Dakota. The second Building of the Year Award was for equestrian facilities over 5,000 sq. ft. Moonstone Farm in Wisconsin consisted of a custom stall barn, hay storage, riding arena, owner's apartment, outdoor paddocks, runin shelters and fenced pastures. Congratulations to the combined efforts of all the **RAM Companies** on winning these prestigious awards.

Here are the highlights of a couple **RAM GC** and **RAM EXC** combined projects:

<u>XTO Corporation:</u> **RAM GC & RAM EXC** completed construction on two new gas compressor stations projects after 2 years of planning, site prep and construction.



<u>DiMax Corporation:</u> A nice little project in our own backyard! This is the second building **RAM GC** has designed and built for DiMax. We started from the ground up (literally) with **RAM EXC** breaking ground, doing the soil correction and building the pad for the building, sewer, water and final grading.



Hillsboro Athletic Complex: And now for something completely different! After several year of oil/gas projects in ND, the Hillsboro School District in ND awarded **RAM GC** the project to upgrade their high school's athletic facilities. The complex included a new state of the art running track surrounding their football field, a shot put field, long jump pit, high jump and triple jump lanes, pole vault pit and discus fields along with a new concession stand, new bleachers and press box. **RAM EXC** created all the precise soil corrections and base prep for the track & all field event areas, finish graded the entire site, reworked the football practice field and seeded everything. The Hillsboro School District had a community open house to show off the finished facilities – there were rave reviews all around.



<u>Watford City Municipal Airport Terminal:</u> And now for something completely different, again in ND! **RAM GC** won the bid to put an addition on the airport terminal in Watford City, ND. And again, **RAM EXC** was called upon to do all the base work for the project. This project will be completed sometime in mid-February.



RAM GC just started another great project in North Dakota. The new Grenora Fire Station will be completed in late summer 2017.

RAM Excavating was also busy this year with many diverse projects of their own!

<u>Jordan Middle School Ball Fields:</u> Created a brand new baseball field with irrigation and regraded and seeded and existing practice field.

<u>K&M Manufacturing</u>, <u>Olivia</u>: Soil correction and base prep for large new steel building, including loading dock area.

<u>Willmar National Guard Field Maintenance Shop:</u> Demo a parking lot, prepped for footing for a new building on the site and put in new sewer line.

Both **RAM GC** and **RAM EXC** have several new projects already in the works for next year. 2017 looks to be another great year for both companies.

Go Green with the RAM Machine

Since the 1970's energy crisis, the research on solar cells to produce electricity has grown in popularity. At first the cost was outrageous and was an impractical solution. In the 1990's the expense of solar panels decreased significantly. The cost and incentive plans through the government and utility companies have also helped to make this a more reasonable choice.



Solar industry growth has caused steadily falling prices for electricity. It is also the green option for energy. It reduces pollution and CO2 emissions by producing electrical power from the sun instead of using the coal fired electric plants. Solar power is emissions free.

Travis Prunty, a customer of RAM, had us design and construct a 36' x 72' x 12' post frame building for him. He is using his building for storage.

A friend of his has solar panels on their home. After hearing what they had to say about their experience he opted to have solar panels installed on the south side of his new RAM building. He has 66 panels that can emit approximately 18.15 kWh. The kWh produced throughout the month on average pays his monthly electric bill. The production varies based on cloudy days, size of system, time of year, and if the panels are in the shade. The only way the panels themselves affect the building is from an aesthetic standpoint.

When Travis purchased his solar panel system. He was able take advantage of a 30% up front federal tax credit and an additional 30% back over a 10 year period from Xcel Energy. The initial cost of his solar panel system should pay for itself within 10 years. His principal reason for making the change is to benefit the environment. His decision to go solar will generate some income but in a residential setting will never be a generous source of income.

The panels have a 25 year warranty and are maintenance free. He had to add the value of the solar panel system onto his home owners insurance. All in all he is happy with his choice and would recommend it to others.

The world is constantly changing and we are continuously changing with it. RAM wants you to be informed of the possibilities available to you.




The Green Red Meat

Miniature cattle are an up and coming market for gourmet restaurants and markets. Their leaner cuts and smaller portions are becoming increasingly popular for the health conscious eaters today. When eating grass fed beef you will find more omega-3 fatty acids, linoleic acid, and antioxidant vitamins. These nutrients reduce your chance of heart disease or cancer.


The real excitement (that your heart will now be able to handle) comes to those of us who love the meat but not the expense. Farmers charge a per pound price for an animal and deliver it to the meat locker for you. The meat processor also charges a per pound hanging weight price. Miniature cows are weighing in at approximately 600 lbs. live weight. The average amount of meat you receive after a mini cow has been processed is 300 lbs. You can select your cuts of beef and size of packages. This much meat will fit in a standard freezer. There is no need to go out and purchase an additional chest freezer.

One cow is the ideal amount of beef to feed a small family for 4-6 months. One dual-purpose mini gives off just the right amount of milk for a family – about 1 1/2 gallons per day. Enough for butter, cheese, and a couple glasses of milk daily.



There are so many reasons to buy into raising miniature cows. You can turn a small acreage into a mini cattle ranch thus reducing your property taxes. In addition, your expenses from the farm are a deduction. Raise your own miniature cattle and know what the animal is eating and how it is being cared for before it goes on your dining room table.

The miniature cattle farmer is benefited from their herd. You only need approximately 1/2 an acre per cow vs 2 acres per full sized cow. You can have several mini- cows on a 2.5 acre hobby farm or homestead. These minis eat 1/3 to 1/2 less feed as their larger counterparts. These little cows come in at a 25% higher feed conversion rate than traditional cows which means more profit.



RAM recently built a 30' x 64' x 10' building for a miniature cattle and miniature horse ranch. Terry shared that the building has helped organize him tremendously. It lessens his chores, brings the animals in from the cold so they can congregate together, and there is still room to store his equipment, machinery, and hay.



Terry just started running his ranch 6 months ago. He really loves working with the animals on the farm. Right now he is only a part timer but he would like to progress to the point where the ranch would be his full time job. Quality over quantity is his motto.

The biggest issue he has run into is that people aren't aware they can go directly to the farmer for purchase of meat. This will be his largest marketing issue.

Whether you are buying locally, starting your own farm, or simply reading the article I think we can all agree the "green" red meat sounds like a genius idea and an enticing entree.

Fun was had by all RAM employees on a beautiful summer afternoon this year.




